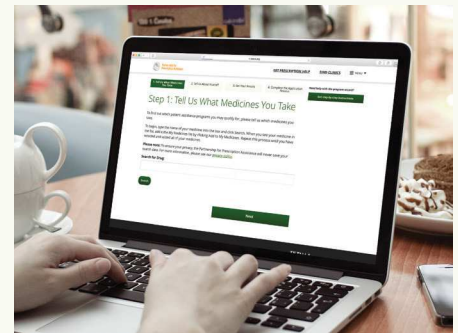

HOW DOES PPA WORK?

1. Go to www.pparx.org.

4. Get your results and decide which patient assistance programs you would like to apply to.
5. Complete the application process.
